Attractions of Huronia

Sainte-Marie among the Hurons and the SS Keewatin

The very first European settlement in Ontario was Sainte-Marie among the Hurons, inhabited by French Jesuits from 1639 to 1649. Located near Midland, it is our first attraction on today's visit to the historical Huronia area of Ontario. **A Tour is arranged here for you, conducted by a knowledgeable Guide in period costume.** Following our tour, a **Light Luncheon is enjoyed at the Restaurant Sainte-Marie** (*Soup, Sandwich and Dessert plus Coffee/Tea*). After lunch, we'll motor on to nearby Port McNicholl to visit our second attraction, the famous **SS Keewatin Steamship**, a lovingly restored passenger ship that once sailed between the Ontario ports of Port Arthur/Ft. William (now Thunder Bay) on Lake Superior, and Port McNicholl on Georgian Bay (Lake Huron.) The steamship, now permanently docked in Port McNicholl, carried passengers and freight between these two ports for almost 60 seasons for the Canadian Pacific Railway's Great Lakes Steamship Service. **A Guided Tour of this elegant steamship** is arranged for you (2:30 p.m. – 3:45 p.m. approx.) before we bid goodbye to historic Huronia and head for home.
